Game Changers: Building Your Budget for the Big Picture

ResourceX is working with our Priority Based Budgeting (PBB) Communities to move beyond outdated systems to achieve a true programbased budget solution within OnlinePBB and advance local government thinking beyond the traditional approach to budgeting. With OnlinePBB Budgeter, we have created a new pathway to achieve budget transformation recognizing the power and potential of program and priority based budgeting data. In 2022 the City of Flagstaff Built their Budget for the Bigger Picture by using OnlinePBB Budgeter to build their proposed 2022-2023 budget. Building their budget at the program level enabled staff and council to consider each funding request through the lens of their Carbon Neutrality Plan (CNP) ultimately identifying over \$2\text{Million in new CNP investments!

From Steel City to Sustainability, the Pittsburgh Story

Serving as the Mayor of the City of Pittsburgh from 2014 – 2022, Mayor Peduto led the repositioning of the city from an environmentally and fiscally challenged city to one of financial health, climate leadership and leadership in wrestling with decades of social inequality. Many communities of all sizes face these same challenges and recognize the need to address them, but fail to recognize their power and capacity to do so. Local governments cannot afford to be beholden to the status quo of municipal management; the stakes are too high. Municipalities must use data and reframe the discussion. ResourceX was a critical part of this journey and the City of Pittsburgh's ability to plan, prioritize and recognize its financial capabilities to invest in the challenges of climate and inequality.

Achieving Your Sustainability and Climate Ambitions

Creating a climate action plan and funding that plan are two different challenges municipalities try to tackle. Establishing goals that are meaningful and measurable in your community is something that local governments stand to achieve with far greater success than other levels of government. To fund those initiatives requires excellent communication and cooperation at all levels within that local government.



Approving and Applying Programmatic Initiatives in Your Community

Salt Lake City launched their program budgeting work with ResourceX as a part of the Results for America City Budgeting for Equity and Recovery (CBER) initiative in the spring of 2021. The city piloted their program budgeting initiative across their Finance and Police Departments. This work was done as part of the Racial Equity in Policing Commission. The Commission on Racial Equity in Policing was formed to examine SLCPD's policies, culture, and budget and any City policies that influence SLCPD's culture or policies.

Through the leadership of Salt Lake City CFO Mary Beth Thompson and Budget Director John Vyuk (and budget analysts across Finance and Police Departments), the city developed a Program Budget across both departments. Through this effort, the city has developed a powerful new program level data set that identifies the programs the city delivers, the true cold program delivery, and programmatic alignment with specific outcomes such as equity and sustainability. And ultimately, this initiative produced multiple new program specific budget proposals with the intention of better aligning Police programs with equity goals as identified by the Racial Equity in Policing Commission.

Creating and Leading an Anti-Fragile Organization

The concept of anti-fragile leadership is rooted in the notion that organizations not only can recover but improve when they grapple with adverse events. In essence, they show resilience, but also the agility to adapt and improve based on new insights. On one end of the spectrum, a fragile organization is vulnerable to disruption and breaks easily. Becoming resilient means the organization is able to rebound in the face of disruptive events. It is strong, hard to knock off stride, and able to carry out its mission. An anti-fragile organization is a step beyond that: It's flexible and changes its shape and structure as it responds to stressors. It gets stronger and smarter, better equipped to anticipate novel challenges and navigate uncertainty. Module 5:The limitation of "Level 2" and "Level 3" is that your organization will reach a limit, a state of optimization where there are no more advantageous trade-offs left to consider. Not that an organization has to wait until this point of optimization to pursue "Level 4" whatsoever, but the idea here is to leverage and partner with other service providers who are aligned in their work with the results your organization is striving to achieve, and take advantage of their efforts, their resources, as if your organization and theirs were one and the same. Massive regional resource optimization can be achieved via Program Mapping and entails understanding what other organizations provide, and where it would be advantageous for your organization to opportunistically outsource various programs (leveraging other entities who can provide them just as well, or retire them altogether), regionalize to jointly provide programs together (public-private partnerships, or merged services provided more efficiently together), or entrepreneurially in-source programs to maximize incoming

Rethinking Budgeting

Local governments have long relied on incremental, line item budgeting where last year's budget becomes next year's budget with changes around the margin. Though this form of budgeting has its advantages and can be useful under circumstances of stability, it also has important disadvantages. The primary disadvantage is that it causes local governments to be slow to adapt to changing conditions. The premise of the Rethinking Budgeting initiative is that the public finance profession has an opportunity to update local government budgeting practices to take advantage of new ways of thinking, new technologies, and to better meet the changing needs of communities. This body of work describes why Rethinking Budgeting is necessary and what you can expect from the Rethinking Budgeting initiative in the future.

A Better Budget is Not a More Complex Budget: Budgeter in Action

Budgets are how cities truly express their priorities. Traditional budgets track line items across departments, such as postage and paper. But they don't organize line items by program or activity, making it challenging to understand where each line item goes. Traditionally, departmental budget requests would identify line items to increase or decrease. With the priority-based program budget, each request can be tied to defined programmatic outcomes and detailed information based on achieving an organization's goals.
